The Boston Fellows Program has a rolling admissions policy but applications received on or before the deadline posted below will receive priority attention. Our admission process is very selective and the 12 spaces are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Generally speaking we reserve six spaces for men and six for women. A visit to Boston is strongly encouraged but is not mandatory.

- April 15 - notified by April 30
- May 1 - notified by May 15

Boston Fellows

The Boston Fellows is a nine-month (Sept-May), whole-life internship for recent university graduates.

The program combines a

- paid internship in a field as close as possible to the Fellow's career interest
- a workplace mentor,
- coursework giving a biblical and theological foundation for engagement in the world,
- cultivation of the spiritual disciplines,
- active involvement in a congregational community, and
- Christian service to the surrounding community.

The Fellows are equipped for a lifetime of service in Christ's kingdom through work, study, worship, and daily life.

Principles

The following are central components of the Boston Fellows experience.

All-of-life

The program is designed to help recent college graduates discover what it means to love the Lord their God with all their heart, all their soul, all their strength, and all their mind, and neighbor as self—in their context. So the program touches on nearly every area of life: vocational, relational, intellectual, physical and especially spiritual, the still point in God at the center of life's vortex.

Internships & Mentors

The program is designed to give Fellows valuable professional experience in a field closely related to their career plans by securing a part-time internship in greater Boston. Each Fellow meets at least monthly with a mentor respected in the working world.

Study

Fellows spend meaningful time together each week studying and discussing topics related to their engagement in the world. They complete two 3-credit-hour graduate courses designed for them in association with Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary and Gordon College.

These courses are team-taught by professors teaching in their fields of expertise and respected professionals in the Boston marketplace speaking from experience.

Service

Fellows are involved in Christian service through the local congregation, typically in youth ministry.

Housing

At no extra cost, Fellows are housed in a group house on the campus of All Saints. or with a host family associated with the local congregation. Each has a private bedroom

Worship & Spiritual Formation

The Fellows program is committed to closing the gaps that threaten to separate Sunday and the rest of the week, faith and work, principles and practice, and all like dichotomies. Integration of all these areas begins with a solid foundation in spiritual formation, "off-the-job" training for the real world. Worship and life in a local congregation give the Fellows a home base for your calling.

History
